Principal's Report

- Governance Council Guidelines <u>Video</u>
 - o Bylaws- if any questions, please contact Mrs. Cochran
 - Team voting- teachers were voted on the council by other teachers,
 parents were voted on during open house by other parents
 - Guidelines
 - WCSS Charter Goals TGAP's goals align closely with the district goals
 (the ones that pertain to us the most is the graduation rate, GA
 Milestones, 3-5th grade, and increase in the number of students taking
 the MAP in fall and spring will meet their MAP growth goal by 60% (over
 half of the students at TGAP met their growth goal by their spring
 assessments).
 - Robert's Rules of Order- provided to the GC team
 - o Conflict of Interest Form all GC members must sign
- 23/24 Student Enrollment: 502
 - Pre-K: 37 (this includes students who are at another Pre-K, but they fall under TGAP registration. It was asked if it is possible for TGAP to have a Pre-k, Mrs. Cochran explained that there are too many Pre-K's close to

each other. We have applied to have the Pre-k inside TGAP and are waiting to hear back)

- o Kindergarten: 78
- o 1st Grade: 70
- 2nd Grade: 703rd Grade: 90
- o 4th Grade: 78
- o 5th Grade: 79
- It was asked if the 3rd graders coming in have been on grade level- Mrs.
 Cochran explained that there have been some challenges, but the 3rd-grade team is very strong
- Kindergarten and 3rd grade are closed to enrollment at this time The County office decides when a grade level is closed and those students will be directed to go to their district school.
- We have 4 teachers in each grade level
- Kindergarten has 4 paras (one per room)
- o 1st grade has 4 teachers, 2 paras (shared para)
- The 1st and kindergarten paras are used to monitor the lunchroom, and open car doors in the morning/ afternoon
- Curriculum Updates <u>Video</u>
 - MAP (3 times a year) Norm-referenced test (kinder- 1st grade has the test read aloud to them). Given in fall, winter, and spring
 - Heggerty Heggerty as an auditory phonemic awareness piece. It is consistent in every grade level.
 - o Fundations Fundations has workbooks where students are working on handwriting and spelling/ decoding words. It build on each other. UFLI-3rd grade did not receive Heggerty, the county has purchased this to bridge the gap for 1 year.
 - New Math Standards Teachers are relying on the Georgia DOE on the units. White County is creating a math literacy team to form assessments that have rigor and connect to the new math standards. (DOE did not provide assessments for the standards)
- Title I Information Funds
 - o Family Engagement Policy and the family compact were sent out to all parents in Thursday folders with all students. It talks about responsibilities, and school improvement goals (Title 1 meeting is next Tues Oct 3rd). TGAP is trying to improve family engagement with Title 1 meetings by having it 2 times a day for options for parents to come (8:30-5) and we will also have family events in the building.
 - School-Parent Compact
 - o Communication This includes the family newsletter, and principal chat, and inside the newsletter parents asked for more data to be included. ○

 - Fundraisers
 - Art To Remember has art teachers mail in student artwork using their paper. The company scans the artwork and then creates order forms for parents. These order forms may include coffee mugs, t-shirts, sketchbooks, etc. I have to have everyone's artwork mailed in by October 20th for items to arrive by Christmas. The goal is Christmas gifts! Money from the fundraiser will go towards art supplies. I would love for every child to have a mountain landscape piece ("Together we can move mountains") to take home by the end of the year. Funds would go towards every child having a nice canvas! Additional funds would go towards paint supplies and other necessities.
