The average child is given a smart phone at 10. The average time spent on smartphones:

Tweens- 6 hours a day

Teens-9 hours a day

This is a movement to encourage parents to not allow their children to have smartphones until 8th grade.

Flip phones for students are allowed while still signing the pledge.

Smartphones are changing childhood- they are spending less and less time outside or playing with friends. Smartphones are ADDICTIVE. They have similar responses as drugs and alcohol. Smartphones are an academic distraction, impair kids sleep, screen time impacts behavior, they interfere with relationships, increase the risk for anxiety and depression, and it puts your child at risk for cyberbullying.
